EVACUATION CENTRE

Evacuation Centre set up will be agreed upon by your community and the community hosting.

Most will offer group lodging, food & hydration, showers and washroom facilities. Depending on the length of evacuation, centres may have information on income assistance, mental health supports, recreation, insurance, healthcare and spiritual needs.

Every community is responsible for its members. Those that require special accommodations should notify their own community authorities so that suitable arrangements can be made.



COMMUNITY EMERGENCY PLAN

Your community's evacuation procedures, including routes, transportation options, and reception centres, are outlined in their Community Emergency Plan (CEP).

To ensure you know what to expect during an evacuation, ask your elected officials where you can access the CEP and take time to review the evacuation section in advance. Being familiar with these details can help you stay safe and reduce stress during an emergency.

If your community issues an evacuation order, it's important to leave as quickly and safely as possible.

LEVELS OF RISK

- Travel distances can be long, plan for delays
- Be aware of your community's evacuation routes and methods of transportation"



EVACUATION ORDERS SAVE LIVES

When an evacuation order is issued, it's for your safety.

Staying behind puts you - and emergency responders - at serious risk. If you stay and conditions worsen, rescuers may not be able to reach you safely.

Listen to and check your local news channels, radio, community web pages and social media for the best sources of information during an emergency.
